

Buckets of Love for Camphill

The Buckets of Love project was launched by Paul du Toit of the Wine Village, with the co-operation of Checkers, just before the Christmas holidays.

Du Toit sold 74 buckets – starting with the mayor, who bought the first one. Each bucket had a list of nutritional food items to be purchased for the benefit of the children of Camphill School.

The Wine Village staff put their money where their mouth was, buying eight buckets, and several members of the public challenged each other, with one woman buying six buckets.

The Wine Village intends continuing with the project for the next 12 months and invites members of the public and businesses to contact them if they would like to get involved. The bucket, with its contents, costs R100 each.

“This initiative is of huge assistance to Camphill School, assisting significantly to reduce its high food bill,” said Elaine Davie, PR and fundraiser at Camphill School.
